#### Guidelines:

- The incoming student and his/her family must be new to Providence in the school year 2021-2022.
- The new student must be enrolled at Providence until the end of the school year.
- The current family's accounts must remain current throughout the year.
- For each new family you recruit who meets the above criteria and registers, we will give you a \$500 credit on one child's monthly tuition payment for the final month of the 2021-2022 school year. Those who pay annually or on the tri-pay plan will receive a rebate check. There is no limit to the number of credits you can earn.
- It is our understanding that any tuition credit you may earn through the Referral Rewards program is taxable income according to Internal Revenue Service regulations and reportable on your federal and state income tax returns. Providence Christian Academy will notify each recipient family and the Internal Revenue Service of this credit in accordance with I.R.S. regulations. ### **Purpose of Form**

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN). individual taxpaver identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

• Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding,
